College of Arts & Media (CAM) programs strive to reflect dynamic creative industries; therefore courses and/or sequencing may be revised.

**NOTES**

\*Must be completed with C-/1.7 or better.

\*\*Must be completed with C/2.0 or better. "C-" or less will not fulfill the requirement.

**GENERAL NOTES:**

1. All upper division FINE courses must be taken at CU Denver unless otherwise approved by department.
2. Students must complete a minimum of 120 total credits.
3. Students must maintain at least a 2.0 University of Colorado cumulative GPA.
4. A total of at least 45 upper division (3000/4000 level) credits is required.
5. At least 30 total credits must be completed in residency at CU Denver.
6. At least 27 of all FINE credits (at any level) must be taken at CU Denver.
7. At least 24 credits of total FINE courses must be upper division (3000/4000 level).
8. Students must abide by all published prerequisites and corequisites, including minimum grades.
9. CAM policy states that students who miss the first two class sessions of any CAM course can be administratively dropped. Likewise, students may not be permitted to add any CAM course if they have missed the first two class sessions.
10. Students must apply to graduate. Consult the online academic calendar for deadlines.
11. Consult the the CAM website, the CU Denver catalog and website, and the Visual Arts Student Handbook for complete requirements and policies.
