GENERAL NOTES:

1. Students considering additional study in graduate school of art history or a related discipline are encouraged to take one year of German and one year of a Romance language (Italian, French, or Spanish) as part of their undergraduate degree.
2. All upper division (3000/4000 level) FINE courses must be taken at CU Denver unless otherwise approved by department.
3. Students must complete a minimum of 120 total credits.
4. Students must maintain at least a 2.0 University of Colorado cumulative GPA.
5. A total of at least 45 upper division (3000/4000 level) credits is required.
6. At least 30 total credits must be completed in residency at CU Denver.
7. At least 21 of all FINE credits (at any level) must be taken at CU Denver.
8. At least 18 credits of total FINE courses must be upper division (3000/4000 level).
9. Students must abide by all published prerequisites and corequisites, including minimum grades.
10. CAM policy states that students who miss the first two class sessions of any CAM course can be administratively dropped. Likewise, students may not be permitted to add any CAM course if they have missed the first two class sessions.
11. Students must apply to graduate. Consult the online academic calendar for deadlines.
12. Consult the the CAM website, the CU Denver catalog and website, and the Visual Arts Student Handbook for complete requirements and policies.
